
Year 1 Homework Due in: Wednesday 2nd May

Reading: Please continue to read with your child every day. Record this in the reading records 2-3 times every week. Please revise all phonics sounds, especially those your child may be struggling with. Please use your sheets that we are sending home to support.



Spelling: Please practise Year 1 spellings from the back of your homework book. You can choose a way to practise them from the ideas sheet.

English: This week we have been learning how to write a letter. Write a thank you letter to someone in your family or community.

Support: Try to use interesting adjectives to describe your feelings.

Challenge: Use formal vocabulary (e.g. yours sincerely).



Maths: We have been learning about multiplication and word problems. Try and solve the following problem: Would you rather have 4 groups of 3 apples or 2 groups of 5?



Support: Create the maths problem by using real-life objects e.g. apples. Talk about which group you would prefer. Why?

Challenge: The princess was hungry after she had been rescued from the tower. She was offered 3 packs of 3 apples **or** 2 packs of 5 apples. Which do you think she should choose? Explain why.

Outdoors: We are learning about castles and materials. Can you go for a walk or visit your local garden centre and see what different types of stones you can collect? Which type of stone do you think would be best to build a castle? Why? Put them into a plastic bag and bring them into school.
