Understanding the World

- Use an iPad to capture your friend making a superhero pose.

Physical Development

- Design a superhero cape using different materials
- Create a superhero mask using different resources and tools

Communication and Language

- Write a list of special powers, choosing one and acting it out to a friend. See if a friend can guess which power you are acting out.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Potato printing, using half a potato and dipping it into different coloured paint. Make a repeated pattern
- Make a Supertato using real potatoes
