



## School Aims

We aim to stimulate and inspire our children, develop their interests and equip them with lifelong learning skills through the provision of a broad, rich and exciting curriculum which focuses on developing children's love of learning.

### Messages from Mrs Quartson

It has certainly been a busy couple of weeks at school with all the excitement around the snow last week, the Yr 1 Owl visit, lots of school trips and some amazing learning taking place for everyone – a very positive start to the new term. Thank you so much for all your support in helping make it such a great start!

I am aware that some families have found it challenging to pay for recent **class trips**. Having events before and after Christmas is always difficult as it can be an expensive time. Trips have to be booked well in advance – these were booked in the summer term. Going forward, we want to make sure we book more expensive trips at different points in the year. We are also looking at **ways to raise money throughout the year which can be put towards the trip costs in order to keep prices as low as possible**. We have set up the option to **pay by instalments on Parentpay** - you can pay a small amount each week over an extended time to make it more manageable.

If your child is **eligible for Pupil Premium funding**, only **some** of the cost of trips is covered out of this money as the majority is used for additional teaching time to provide appropriate learning support throughout the week. If you have any questions about this, please speak to a Senior Leader, for clarification. Trips and events closely link to the children's learning and therefore, they are not optional. It is vital that **all** children attend. Please speak to the classteacher if you have any concerns about your child attending a trip so we can work with you to address them.

As you will see in the **Friends of Watling Park** section below, Nicola will no longer be Secretary after Friday 15<sup>th</sup> February. She has been an amazing and committed member of the committee and we are very sad to say farewell. In order for FoWP to continue, we must have a Secretary in post, so please consider if you would be willing take on this position, even until the end of the summer term. The work the team are doing to provide a variety of wonderful events for the children and to raise money to set up goal posts in the Muga and a Chill Out Zone in the playground will enhance the opportunities for the children in the school going forward.

### **What would you like parents and carers to know about you and your role as a LAB member?**

I am the staff member representative on the LAB as well as being Inclusion Manager in the school. I was elected by the staff to be their representative so that staff views were heard and considered at each meeting. I also wanted to develop my strategic understanding of how the school operates. I have previously been a school governor and relish opportunity to work alongside other dedicated members of the community who have a commitment to supporting the school to be the best it can be for our children and families.

### **What is your area of focus as a LAB member and what have you found on your visits?**

My focus area as a LAB member is to review and support with developing and reviewing external and internal partnerships. We have identified a number of strengths in this area, many of which I am sure you have supported, such as the increased number of events led by Friends of Watling Park, involvement with a local aged care home and many other positive partnerships.

Currently, I am working alongside the Chair of the LAB to draw up an action plan of next steps we can undertake to further develop community links.

Discussions with children prior to and following events and opportunities focused on building and sustaining partnerships for the school have demonstrated how positively our children see themselves as both members of the school community and also how they are seeing themselves as members of the wider local community. This is a good grounding and will continue to support them as the school develops links and partnerships both nationally and globally in the future.

It is an exciting time to be part of the school, both as a staff member and as a LAB member, as we continue our journey of growing an excellent school together.
